In 2018, the following BSCDB meetings were organized:

The **2018 BSCDB Spring meeting** on "Neural Stem Cells and Cortex **Development**", organized on June 8th, 2018, in Liège.

Two poster prizes of €250 were awarded to:

Anaïs Mounier (ULg) for her poster presentation entitled: "Role of the centrosomal protein CDK5RAP2 in human cochlear development."



The **2018 Joint BSCDB-RBSM Autumn meeting** on "**Cell and Tissue Mechanics in Physiology and Disease**", organized on September 20-21, 2018, in Antwerp.

Two poster prizes of €250 were awarded to:

Abdel Rahman Abdel Fatta (KUL) for his poster presentation entitled: "Mechanotransduction in human pluripotent stem-cells – cell and matrix mechanics at the macroscale."

Louis Van der Meeren (UGent) for his poster presentation entitled: "Nanostructured biointerfaces on titanium with an active enzyme for cell growth stimulation."





In addition, during the Autumn meeting, *dr. Sylvain Delaunay* (ULg) was awarded the <u>2018</u> <u>BSCDB PhD Excellence Award</u> of €5.000 for his work on "Analysing the versatile roles of RNA modifications in cancer."

Michael Starring (KUL): €400 for attending the attending the "Gordon Research Conference on Lymphatics" (Luca, Italy) in March 2018, with the following abstract: "Mouse lymphatic valve leaflet development depends on BMP-SMAD mediated signalling."

Alessandra Quarta (UA): €400 for attending for attending the "WGC Advanced Course on Genetic Engineering of Mammalian Stem Cells" (Cambridge, UK) in March 2018, with the following abstract: "Distinct in vivo properties of brain trauma-associated microglia and macrophages are recapitulated by in vitro cultured iPSC-derived microglia and macrophages."

Nathan Criem (KUL): €400 for attending the "Gordon Research Conference: Endothelial Cell Phenotypes in Health and Disease" (Lucca, Italy) in July 2018, with the following abstract: "The epicardium obscures interpretations on endothelial-to-mesenchymal transition in the mouse atrioventricular canal explant assay."

Melissa Schepers (UHasselt): €500 for attending the "Gordon Research Seminar - Cyclic Nucleotide Phosphodiesterases: "Novel Approaches, Technology and Therapeutic Targets in Cyclic Nucleotide Phosphodiesterase Signaling" (Newry, USA) in June 2018, with the following abstract: "The Phosphodiesterase 4 (PDE4) inhibitor roflumilast improves remyelination in a mouse model for multiple sclerosis."

Thomas Naert (UGent): €500 for attending the "17th International Xenopus Conference" (Seatle, USA) in August 2018, with the following abstract: "CRISPR/Cas9-based in vivo identification of therapeutic targets in Xenopus tropicalis cancer models reveals EZH2 as novel drug target in desmoid tumor-type fibromatosis."

Gauhar Masgutova (UCL): €500 for attending the "SfN Neuroscience 2018" meeting (San Diego, USA) in November 2018, with the following abstract: "Onecut transcription factors control the development of sensory neurons in the dorsal root ganglia."

2019 BSCDB Travel Awards - Application deadlines

Pre-doctoral researchers and junior post-doctoral researchers (max 2 years after obtaining the PhD degree) can apply for travel grants of at maximum 400 € (within Europe) or 500 € (outside Europe) for the purpose of attending an international meeting or course in the broad field of cell and developmental biology. In 2019, the BSCDB will award 4-6 of these travel grants.

The following application deadlines will apply:

- **31/05/2019** for conferences/courses between 01/06/2019 and 31/08/2019.
- **31/08/2019** for conferences/courses between 01/09/2019 and 31/12/2019.
